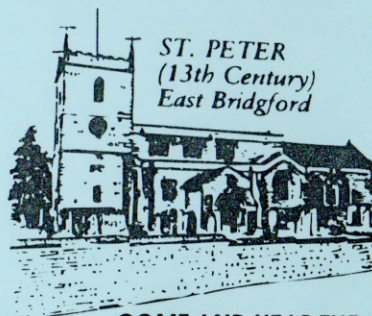

THE CAST

Jean Starbuck (Helen) : She has appeared in many plays over the years, her last appearance was in 'Play On' as playwright Phyllis Montague. She directed 'Dame of Sark' among many other plays and can always be seen during set building usually with a paint brush or screwdriver in her hand.

Jacky Harris (Joyce): Once again she plays daughter to Jeff Caunt (George), who is her real father. She appeared in our last play as his 'Delinquent' daughter. Last year she changed her name from Caunt to Harris as she got fed up with people thing she was Jeff's wife!

Jeff Caunt (George): Jeff once again is cast as a father - first time, however, with two daughters (only one of his own). For the first time with E.B.D.G., Jeff is able to use his native accent - he has previously been Australian, German, Irish and American, to name a few.

Kate Thornburrow (Peggy): Kate is more commonly found backstage, or directing. She has been released on the unsuspecting public most recently as the Dame of Sark and directed 'Dead of Night' which was awarded the Belper Cup in the 1992-3 NANDA festival.

Alan Haycock (Andie): Once again our talented Rector appears in this his 25th part with E.B..D.G., since he joined us in 1980. He won the NANDA Best Actor award last year for the part of George in 'Two & Two Make Sex', and the Rushcliffe Best Actor award in 1986 for the part of Hobson in 'Hobson's Choice'.

Geoff Morgan (Eric): This is Geoff's second acting role for E.B.D.G., since his aerobatic debut in 'Play On' last year. He has designed our sets and directed his last production 'Dear Delinquent'.

Rob Levis (Norman): Like many others he started by just helping out at set building, then he followed in his wife's footsteps and trod the boards, got hooked and has never looked back. A valued member of our committee, he is Treasurer. Rob played Def. Sgt. Pigeon in our last play.

Jim Brennan (Pianist): Jim is a valued friend of the Drama Group, a loyal supporter always in the audience, but this is not the first time he has worked with us. If you come to our summer charity evening you may have seen him perform before.
