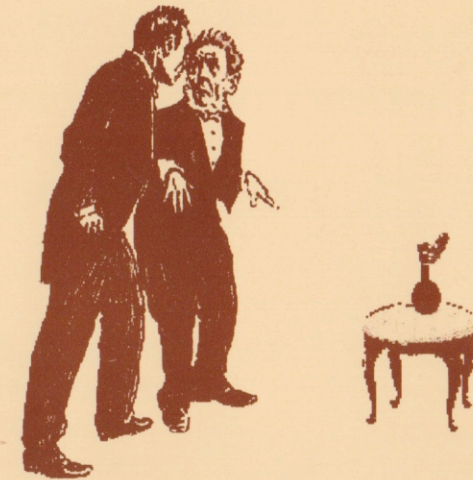


Molly Wood. Molly plays Lord Arthur's Great-Aunt, a character who loves life and is determined to hang on to it.
