

Classic play to get the works

A LOST scene from Oscar Wilde's classic play The Importance Of Being Earnest is to be premiered in

Notts by an amateur group.

The play was originally written as a four-act piece and revised by Wilde to a three-act version — to accommodate the one-act curtain-raiser so popular at the time — for its first performance in February 1895.

One of the casualties of this surgery was Mr Gribsby, of Parker and Gribsby Solicitors, in a scene which theatre critic James Agate described thus: "The fun in the scene which Wilde deleted is better than any living playwright can do."

For many years, the scene was apparently lost, surviving only in a German translation of the four-act play.

It has occasionally surfaced in performance, but infrequently enough for it to be generally unknown.

Now, on the centenary of the first production of *The Importance Of Being Earnest*, East Bridgford Drama Group is to present the Notts premiere of the lost scene featured in a new and improved three-act play with Gribsby added.

Performances will be given in the Village Hall, East Bridgford, from Tuesday, June 13, until Saturday, June 17.
