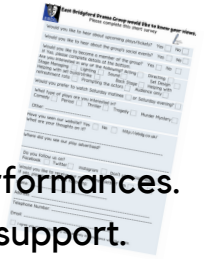

Meet Jim Costello



" After an interesting and varied career, Scotsman Jim Costello has now written two novels which tell a rich and compelling story.

His working life included psychiatric nursing, the Royal Navy, gents' outfitting, the civil service, and political campaigning and fundraising at every level of government. After politics Jim retrained as a Driving Instructor and enjoyed many years getting people through that life changing test.

Jim has always had a love of the sea and of science fiction His other interests and hobbies include backgammon, fish keeping, gardening, photography and rabbits.

Jim has now completed his second novel, which is a continuation of the story he created in his first. The first book tells the story of an ordinary man whose very average and stable life is suddenly tipped over and disrupted by life changing events which happen one after the other.

His wife dies and the bereavement leaves him devastated. Just as he is getting his life back together he scoops the lottery, and wins more money than he could ever imagine.

Next, a hospital error informs him that a rare illness will kill him within a few years. He is now unbelievably rich, but has little time in which to spend it. His life long dream is to have a boat. He decides, in the time he has left, to buy it, sail into the sunset, and die happy. The story follows the sequence of events, and how he reacts.

Throughout the story the recurring question is asked. Do good and bad things happen for no other reason than completely random luck? Or is there a greater power at work, which makes our fate and our destiny pre-ordained and unavoidable?

The second novel continues the story. The adventure is filled with surprises, twists and turns. When Jim Costello tells you a story you can never be sure what is about to come next.
