Members' Spotlight

Meet David Valentine



I was born into a very theatrical family. My mother trod the boards with the Leicester Amateur Operatic Society as well as singing in various choirs. In the 1950s My Mother and Father were 2 of the founders of the QT Drama group in Syston Leicester, still performing today. It was called the QT group because they rehearsed at the Methodist Hall in Birstall, and performing plays was frowned upon by Methodists. My father wrote and directed a Men only Pantomime every year, raising tens of thousands of pounds for the Methodist church and for the Hospice LOROS. I appeared in many church revues and Pantomimes. The picture shows me as a Hula Hula girl in one of Dad's Pantos, singing 'I am 16 going on 17'!...... I continued acting and singing at school, as well as playing the trombone at school and with Leics. County Youth Orchestra, - our tour of Colwyn Bay is still talked of to this day - not necessarily for the right reasons. I also started up a folk band called 'Folk Like us', where we won a national competition and had a regular Sunday slot on Radio Leicester. I also appeared with the Leicester Operatics in 'Song of Norway' and 'Carousel'

At college I appeared as 'Sailor Sawney' in Osbournes 'Live like Pigs'. Moving into teaching I produced and appeared in several productions, - Fagin in Oliver, Jud Fry in Oklahoma, and as the 'Positive Action Man' in 'Dracula Spectacula' as examples. I was also in a Folk/Rock band, - 'Prester John'

When Jackie and I got together it became clear how talented an actress she is, and we decided that we would like to work together in a Drama group. Jackie had acted with the EBDG in a previous life, and so it was they on whom we inflicted ourselves. Although I have appeared in many productions, Directing is my favourite. Acting credits include 'Reg' in the Ayckbourn trilogy 'the Norman Conquests', Rex in 'We don't want you to Lose you' and being upstaged by Jackie's sweatband as Thomas in 'It's never too late'.

As regards Directing it has been a privilege to work with such talented actors. My favourite Directing experiences include 'Gaslight', Snake in the Grass', 'Bunkered', 'Volunteers', 'Scared to Death' and 'Gosforths Fete'

I have also written and directed 4 plays which the group has performed:- 3 Pantomimes, - 'Babes in the Wood', 'Humpty Dumpty' and the 'Pied Piper of Hamelin'. What particularly pleased me with the pantomimes was working with the Children from St. Peter's Academy in East Bridgford.

I also wrote and directed a full length play 'All Washed Up!' which has subsequently been published by J.Garner-Miller. I am currently working with Jan and Esme on producing a musical for schools - the 'Fabulous Adventures of Marco Polo'


I thoroughly enjoyed my time as Chairperson of East Bridgford Drama Group. During my tenure we managed to increase the membership, as well as purchasing various items of technical equipment to bring us up to date with the digital age, as well as purchasing our new staging - a tremendous group effort.

I was sad to step down as Chairperson, but that was precipitated by health issues; however I continue to be a Director of the Limited Company, as well hoping to Direct one of the Summer plays.

It has been a privilege to be part of the group - one of the finest in the East Midlands, with a technical team second to none (I want it to rain on stage Jon!, I want it darker Julz, but I want the audience to be able to see!) and always acting to the very highest of standards (and never knowingly underfed!). Our weekend set-build sessions are a phenomena in their own right and long may they continue!
